

May/June volunteer positions (these are tasks before the program- they are flexible-you can do a few hours at a time). We have particular needs for #1 and #2.

1. *Recruitment and registration volunteers: Calling learners and helping them complete a registration form with basic information (like name address, where they are from), education level, and barriers to learning.
2. *Test Guide: The test to place learners in a class is given online and someone needs to be available on a parallel computer (in your own home) to give instructions and answer questions during the test.
3. Technology volunteers: Some of our learners have not used online resources in the past. We need some volunteers to work with learners and their family members (this is often their children who have more language skills and familiarity with technology) to teach them how to get on to zoom meetings before the beginning of July.
4. Orientation Leaders: Volunteers are needed to help with an online orientation for learners explaining the program and the testing process
5. On site registration and testing volunteers: Available during Thursday registration days.

July 5-August 18- volunteer positions (volunteers do not need to work the full 7 weeks- we are flexible)

1. Classroom assistants (trained tutors): Each Tuesday and Thursday classroom will be run by an ESL teacher. We need volunteers in classrooms to help the teacher and to help learners practice their English. We will also need other classroom assistants to help on Wednesdays when tutor volunteers will be running a variety of programs. Volunteers may be in the church based classroom or online.
2. Classroom teachers (trained tutors): We are looking for tutors who would be willing to teach a topic on Wednesdays. We have developed curriculum for digital literacy, parent/intergenerational literacy, and Learning about America, Patient Portals, writing, and conversation class. However, we would also welcome a class in an area of your expertise.
3. Classroom teachers/assistants to work with English language learner who have very little English and are at the lowest literacy level.
4. Substitute classroom assistants (fill in when someone can't be there)
5. Substitute classroom teachers (fill in when someone can't be there)
6. Registration and Testing on site
7. Receptionists
8. Snacks for morning adults and childcare.
